The Parish Working Group were out in force recently, and have identified the best locations (in their opinion) for the 6 proposed village gates, to potentially include village name and speed limit signs. These 6 locations cover every entry road into the village, which in the opinion of the PWG would remind any vehicles entering Tolleshunt D'Arcy of the speed limit and improve their awareness of the residential nature of the area. If 6 locations are considered too many, then we would prefer to join with the Council to negotiate which ones would have the most impact.

I have attached 12 pictures, 2 for each suggested location - one closer, and one more expanded view, to properly identify the location. If you need me to revisit and get What3Words, for more accurate identification, let me know. We have kept the locations sensible, at either the start of a 30mph speed limit, or just before the first buildings in a street.

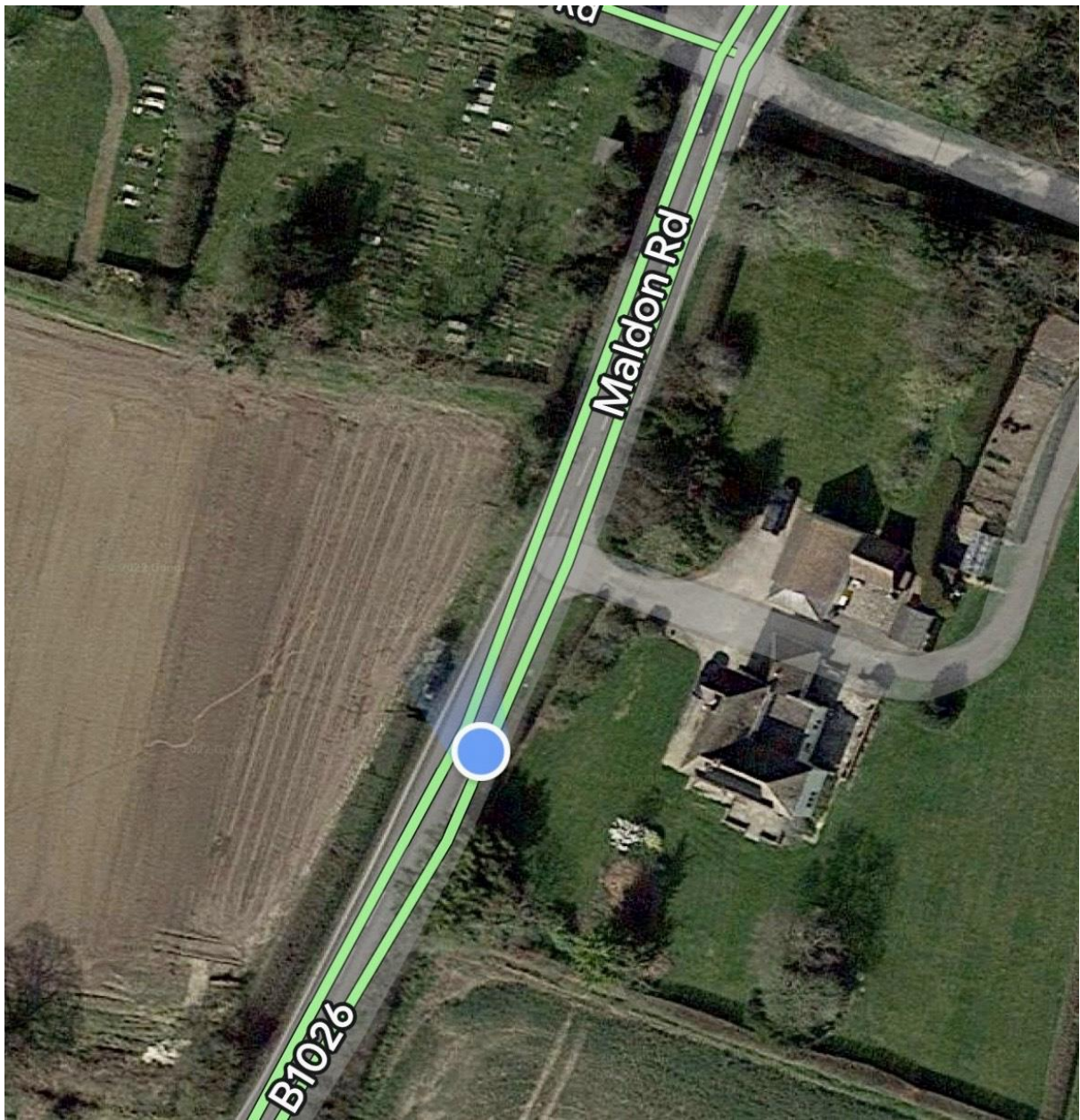

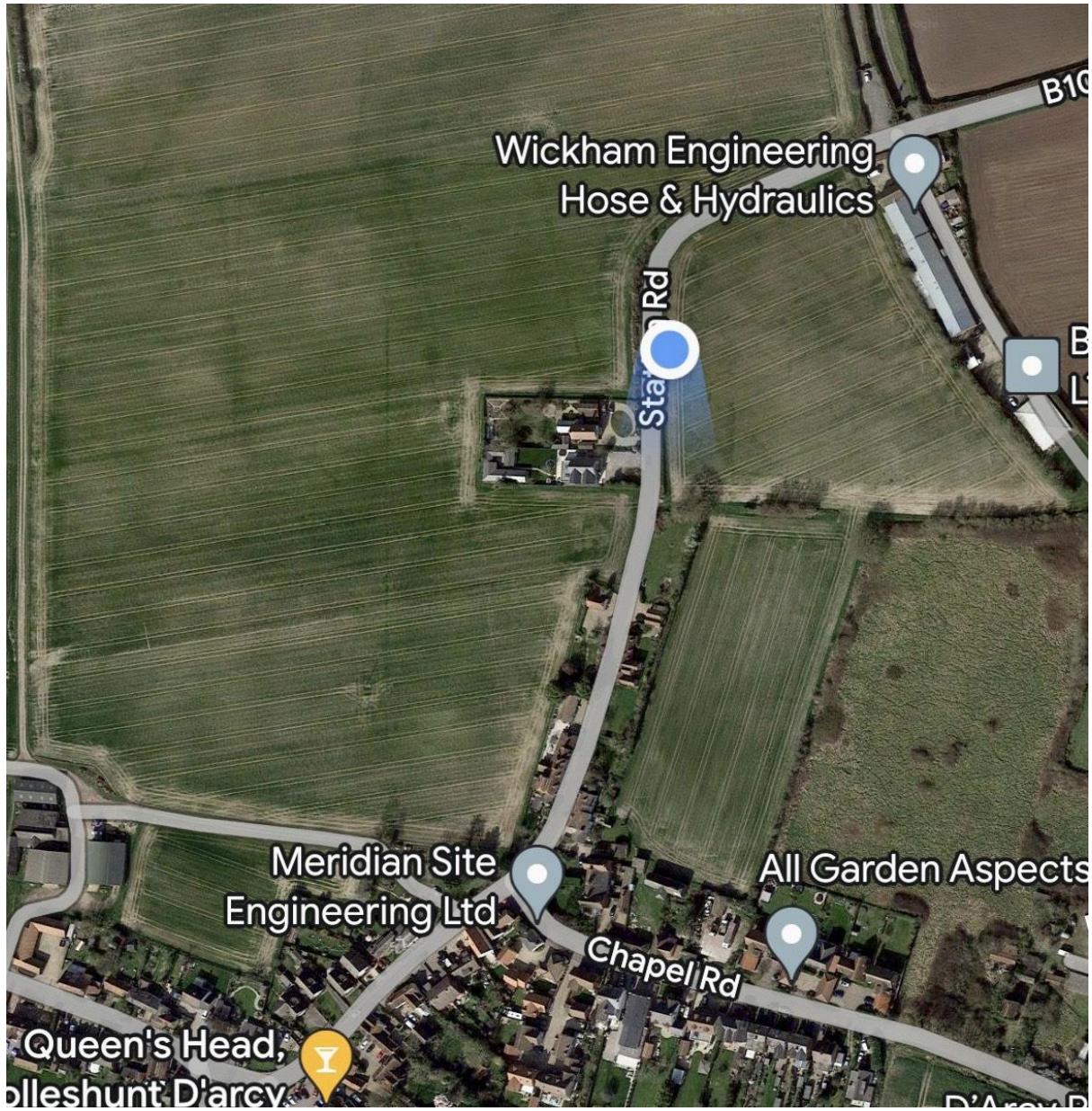
Maldon Road (from Goldhanger direction...)



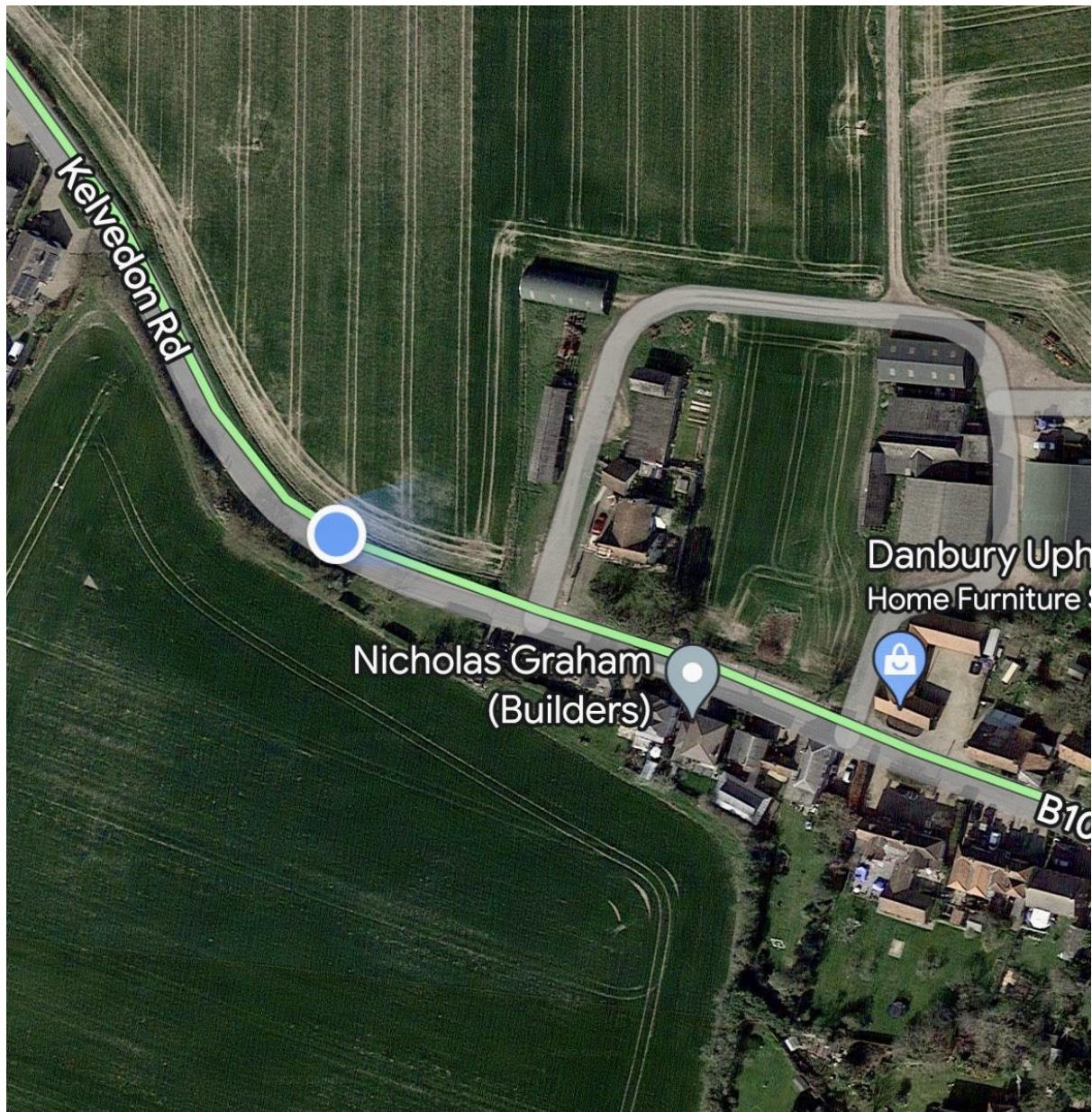


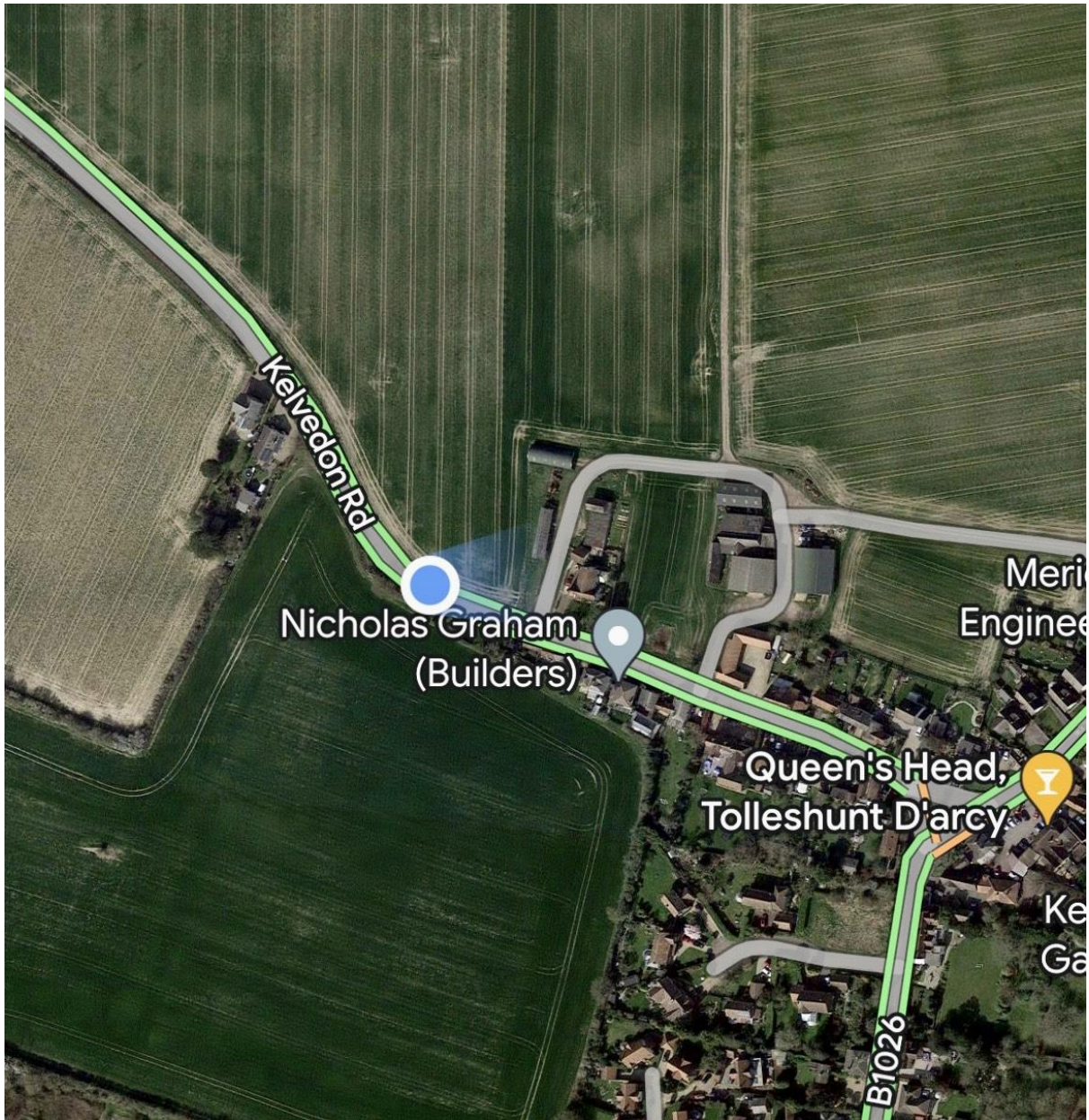
Station Road (from Five Lakes direction...)



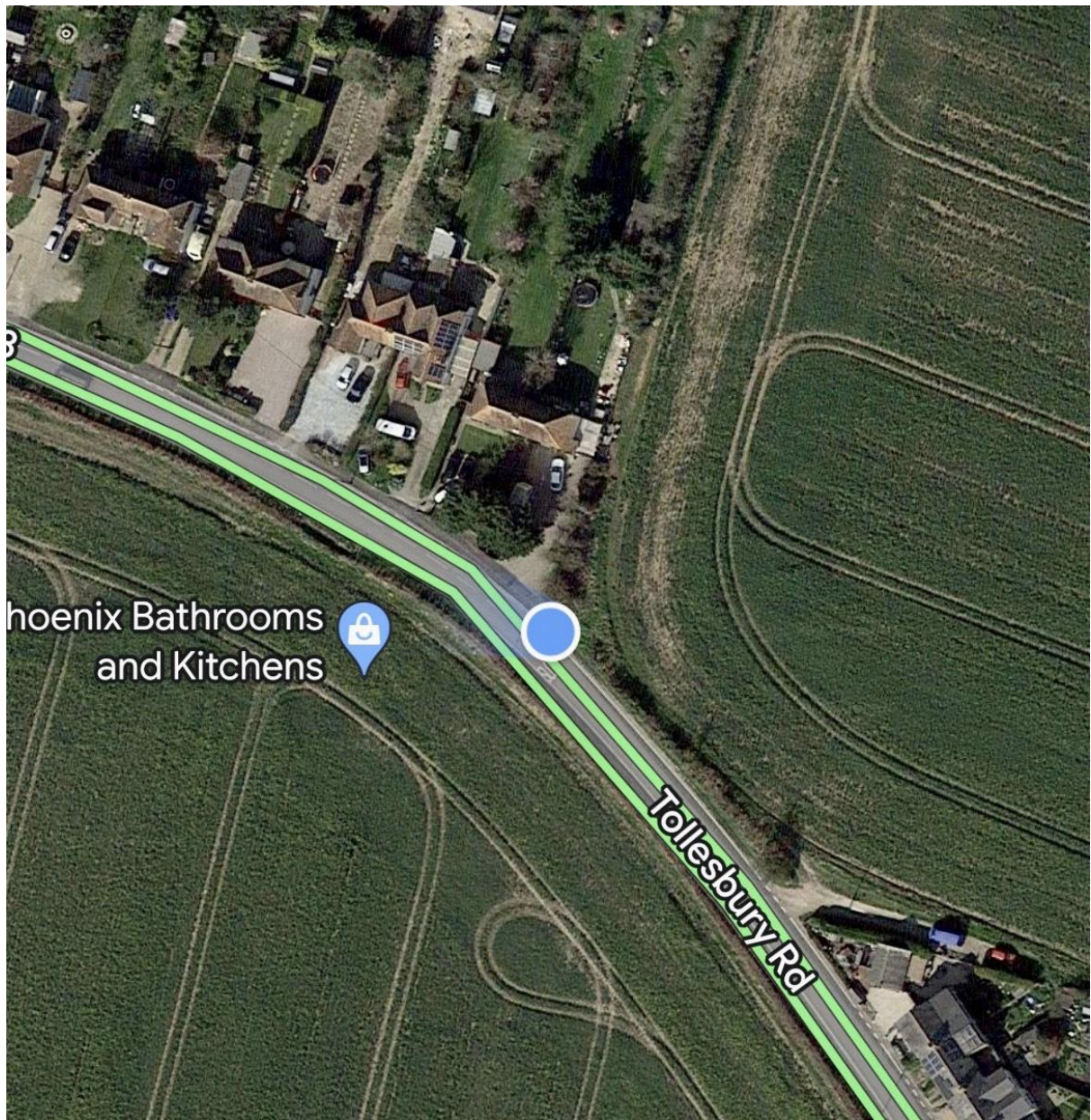


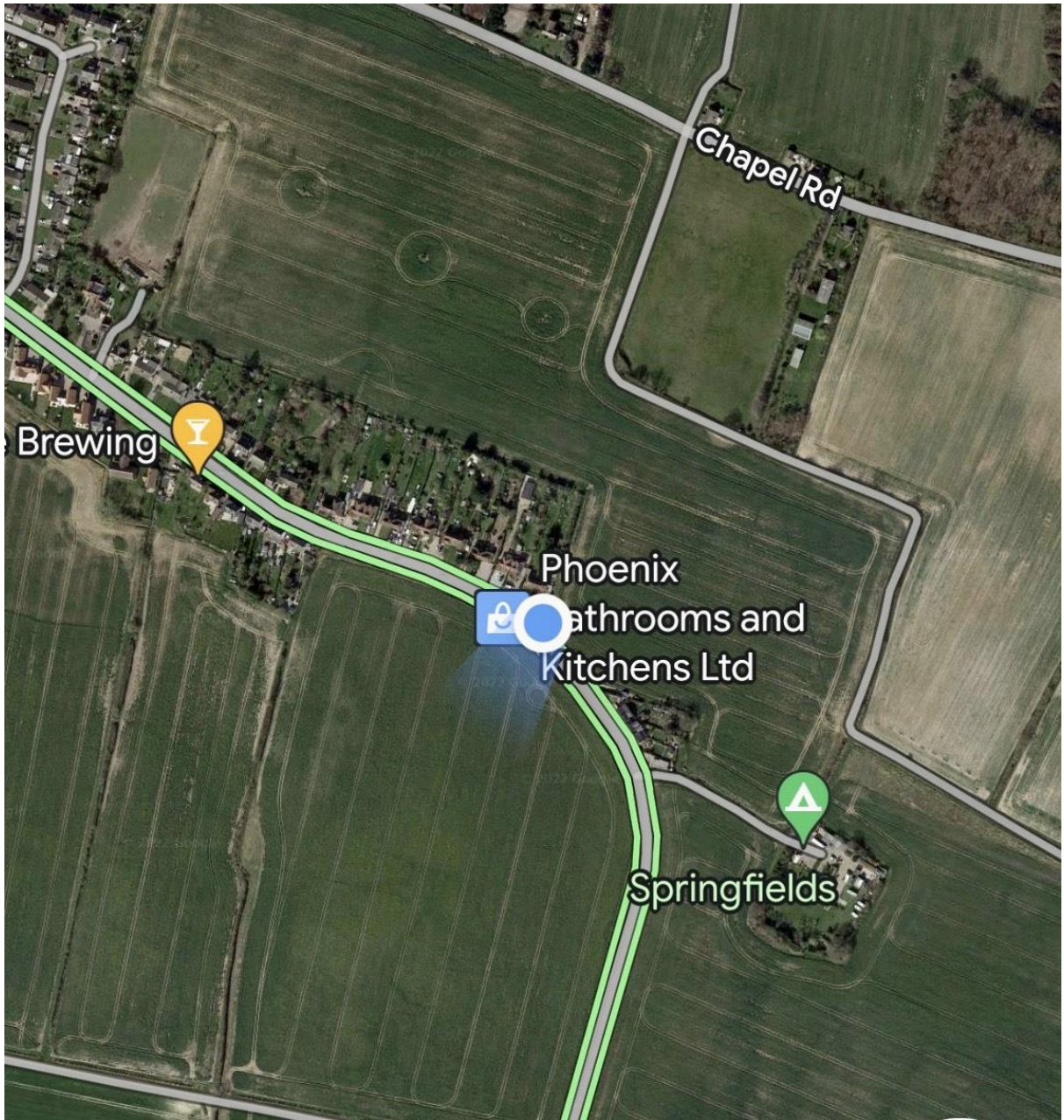
Kelvedon Road (from Tiptree direction...)



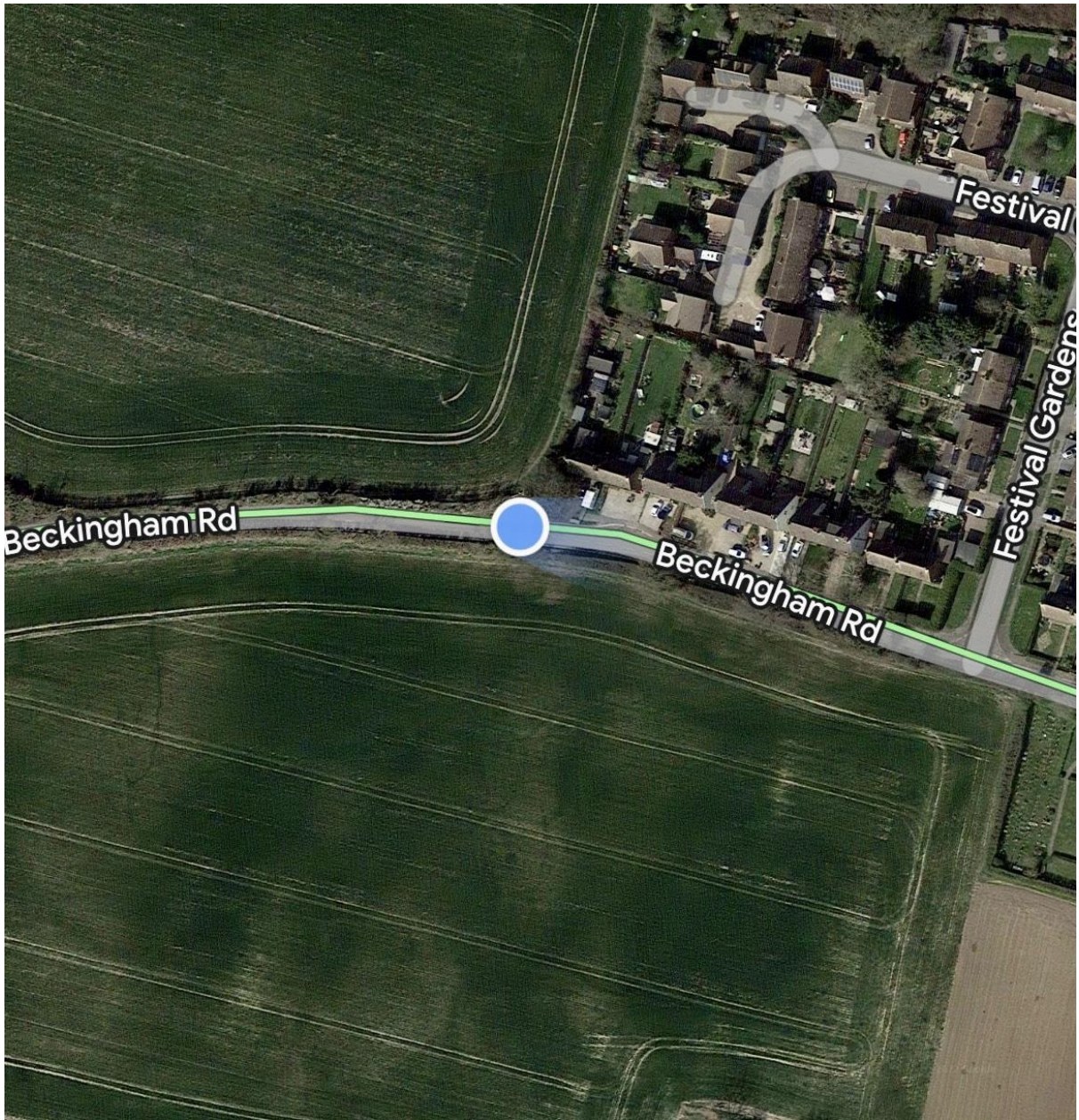


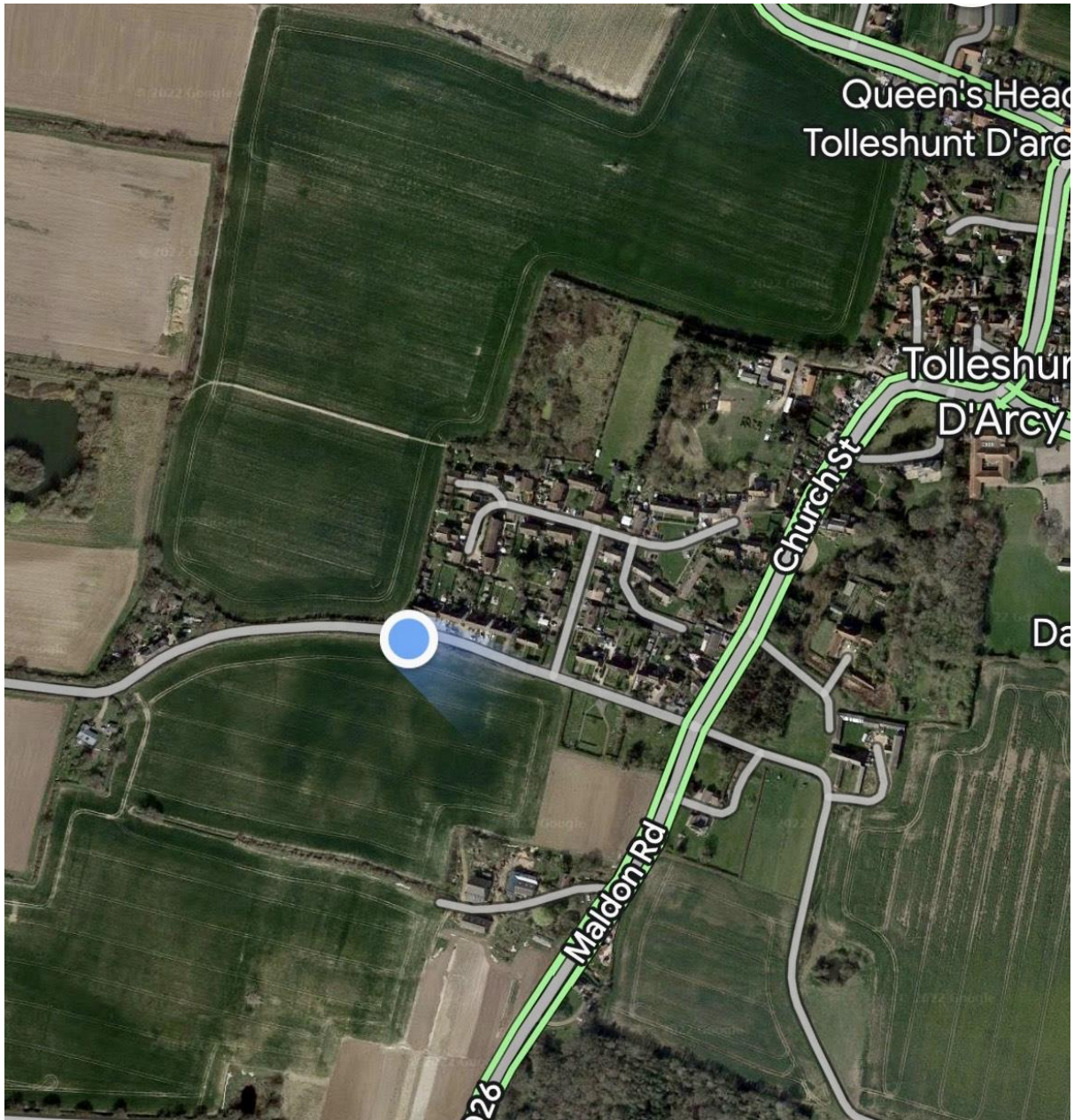
Tollesbury Road (from Tollesbury direction...)



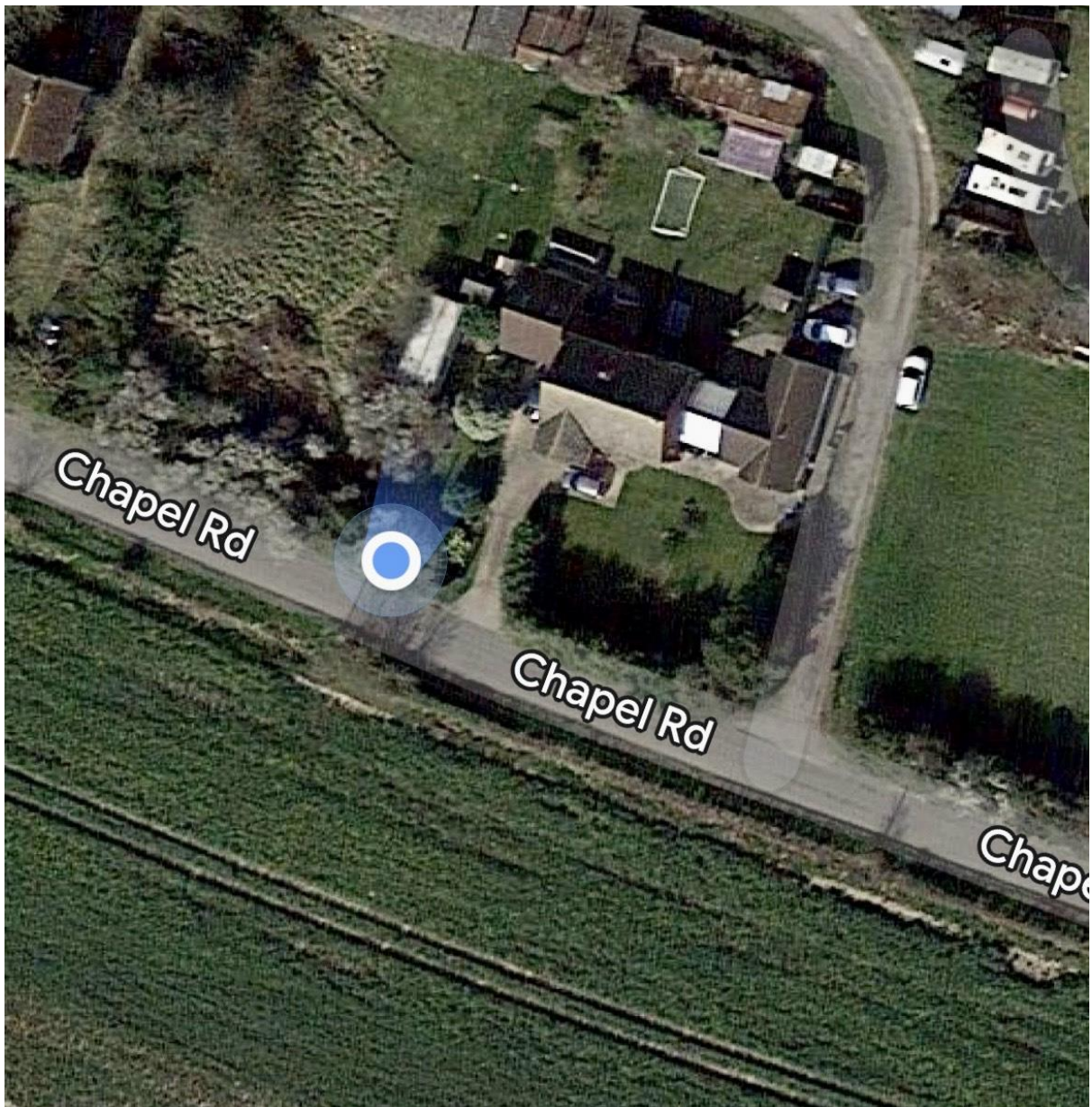


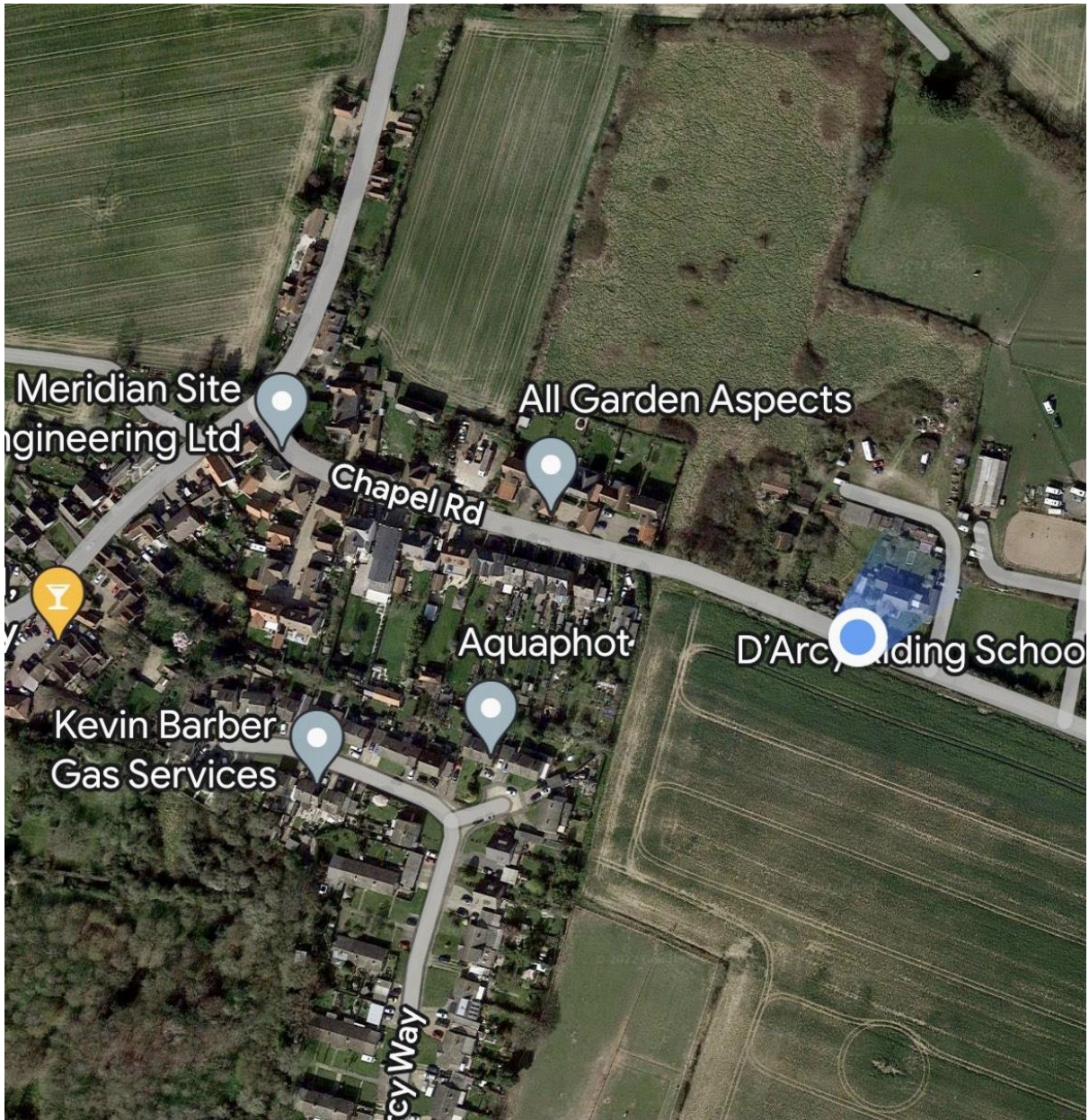
Beckingham Road (from Tolleshunt Major direction...)

REFUSE for the following reasons:-

- 1 The proposed development, by reason of its location, would be disconnected from services and facilities and would provide poor quality and limited access to public transportation, resulting in an increased need of private vehicle ownership. The development would therefore be unsustainable and contrary to the National Planning Policy Framework's "presumption of sustainable development" and policies S1, S8 and T2 of the Maldon District Local Development Plan.
- 2 The introduction of two residential dwellings and associated paraphernalia on the site would represent the inappropriate urbanisation of the site and would have a harmful impact on the rural character of the area, to the detriment of the intrinsic character and beauty of the countryside. The harm is exacerbated by the visual prominence of proposed dwellings in terms of their height and overall bulk. In addition, concerns in respect to the appearance, design features and form of the dwellings are raised.

The proposal is therefore considered to result in demonstrable harm to the character and appearance of the site and locality contrary to policies S8, D1 and H4 of the Maldon District Local Development Plan as well as the principles and guidance contained within the National Planning Policy Framework.

- 3 The proposed development has the potential to have an unacceptable impact on highway safety. Insufficient information has been submitted to allow the Local Planning Authority to determine that the proposed development would not have a detrimental impact upon highways safety, contrary to policy T2 of the Maldon District Local Development Plan and Government advice as contained in the National Planning Policy Framework.
- 4 In the absence of a completed legal agreement pursuant to Section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, securing a necessary financial contribution towards Essex Coast Recreational disturbance Avoidance and Mitigation Strategy or an appropriate mitigation strategy to overcome the

impacts of the development on the European designated nature conservation sites, the development would have an adverse impact on those European designated nature conservation sites, contrary to Policies S1, N2 and I1 of the Maldon District Local Development Plan and the NPPF
